# Reflecting on 2022 & Looking Ahead for 2023

#### *Identified Barriers*

- Promoting CRC screening during COVID-19 pandemic.
- Partners wanting to do work with CHWs and CRC screening but unsure what resources exist.

### What can this group do?

- Leverage lessons learned by collecting and sharing stories from the field.
- Develop webinars and trainings based on needs expressed by partners.
- Find already existing resources for CHW that can be expanded to included CRC screening-specific information.
- Develop strategy to better connect state-level CRC roundtables, coalitions and workgroups to NCCRT.

# NCCRT's Three Priority Areas for 2023

- 1. Mobilize national and community-level efforts that will lead to health equity in CRC screening.
- 2. Support on-time screening as soon as eligible and continued participation per screening recommendations.
- 3. Promote timely colonoscopy follow up to positive (abnormal) non-colonoscopy tests.

# PEPI Community Stakeholder Strategic Priority Team Charge

**Team Charge**: To develop educational resources and implementation tools to help public-facing partners and stakeholders (e.g. employers, community organizations, coalitions, member associations, etc.) take appropriate action to improve colorectal cancer screening rates and awareness.

# Qualities of Successful NCCRT Activities

Collaborative	Engages multiple member organizations and/or requires multisectoral partnerships
Responsive	Responds to the mission of the NCCRT, the priority focus of a task group, or the 80% in
	Every Community Strategic Plan
Impactful	Likely to make a measurable impact on CRC screening rates
Feasible	Requires a 1 to 1.5 year timeline for completion; workable within limits of NCCRT staff,
	members, or external contractor; NCCRT projects typically range from \$25,000 to \$50,000,
	but some projects have been accomplished with little to no funding
Equitable	Addresses barriers to screening in underserved communities
Novel	Does not duplicate or replicate existing projects or resources
Member Supported	Opportunity for NCCRT members to contribute (time, funding, expertise) to supporting the
	development, implementation, dissemination, and evaluation of project
Sustainable	Future updates, ongoing support needed, and dissemination/implementation goals are
	considered
