






### But Not Everyone is Benefiting Equally







Colorectal cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer-related deaths for men and women combined, yet it is often preventable.

It's now recommended that all men and women at average risk of colorectal cancer start regular screening at age 45. Yet, shout 1 in 3 adelts ages 50 and older – about 38 million people – is not getting screened as recommended. The shift to accessing at age 45 will only add to this deficit.






