Sample Letter – NON ADVANCED COLORECTAL POLYPS LETTER

Dear [Patient]:
I would like to inform you of the results from your recent colonoscopy at [medical center] or [date]. As you know, a small growth called a polyp was removed from your colon [rectum] during the procedure. As expected, the polyp was benign (not cancer). Specifically, the polyp was a precancerous nonadvanced adenoma [AND/OR advanced serrated polyp]. This type of polyp, in not removed, could have grown larger over many years and might have turned into a color [rectal] cancer. Because you have a higher chance of developing new polyps and colorecta cancer, you should undergo a repeat colonoscopy in 5 years.
I would also recommend colon cancer screening for any first-degree relatives (brothers, sisters children, and parents) beginning at age 45 [50]. Make your family members aware of these results so that they can discuss screening with their physician.
I would suggest you consider changing any health habits that might increase your chance of forming moreprecancerous polyps and thus colorectal cancer. You may lower your chance of developing future polyps and colorectal cancer by adopting healthy habits such as not smoking maintaining a healthy body weight, being physically active, limiting red and processed meat (such as beef, cold cuts, bacon, and hot dogs), minimizing alcohol intake (or avoiding alcohol altogether), and eating a diet with a lot of fruits and vegetables.
